Colonie - David P. Fonseca, Jr., died peacefully at home on December 20, 2018 at the age of 89.

Survived by brothers Conrad, Anthony, and Rodrigo, sister Olive, ex-wife Wilda (nee Sauv ), children David, Kathleen, Arthur, and Felicity, grandchildren Philip, Stanley, Linus, Emma Rose and Ulysses, and friend Stephanie.

Born in Chicago, IL, he grew up in Chattanooga, TN (where his father was an engineer for the Tennessee Valley Authority). A lifelong enthusiast for outdoor adventure, a Life Scout in the Boy Scouts, Order of the Arrow, he was a hiker of the Great Smoky Mountains, the Green Mountains, and a proud hutman in the White Mountains with the Appalachian Mountain Club.

The eldest child of David and Esther (nee Haven), he attended Notre Dame High School in Chattanooga, TN, the University of Illinois, the University of Tennessee at Chattanooga, (B.A. in Geography), and McGill University, Montr al, Canada.

As a Sergeant in the Air Force he was a meteorologist on Guam. He met his wife of 30 years, Wilda Sauv , the mother of his 4 children, in Montr al. He worked as a regional planner nationally and internationally in locations such as Nashville, TN, Pueblo, CO, Waukesha WI, Columbia, SC, Akron, OH and Dhahran, Saudi Arabia. He worked on the Trans-Alaskan Highway and the Pan American Highway in Costa Rica. He was Director of Planning in Chittenden County, VT and Delaware County, NY. He lived in Taos, NM in the 1980's, and in Albany for the last 30 years of his life. He most recently resided at the Belltrone Senior Living Center.

He is remembered for his unique friendships and kind ability to connect to people in conversation, touching their lives in his own way. Widely traveled, widely read, and a great student of history, he will be missed by his family and friends for his gentle spirituality and his eclectic conversation topics.

The memorial service will be held on January 3rd at 2pm at Christ Our Light Church, Colonie.


