December 2, 1928 - July 29, 2020

Loudonville- Rose M. Kennedy, 91, entered into eternal life on July 29, 2020 at St. Peter's Hospital after a long illness. Born in Albany on December 2, 1928, Rose was the daughter of the late Rose Maimone Catalfamo and Joseph Catalfamo. She was the sister of the late Nancy Pease, of Chester, MA.

Rose was the devoted wife of John P. Kennedy (deceased) for 56 years. They were married on September 11, 1949, and together they raised five children. Rose was the embodiment of selfless motherhood to John J. (Karla) Kennedy, Kathleen (Charles) Azadian, Michael (Sharon) Kennedy, Carolyn Woods, and Kevin (Karen) Kennedy. She is also survived by 11 grandchildren and 9 great-grandchildren.

Family was everything to Rose. After graduating from Roessleville School, Rose married young and focused on the well-being of her children. She worked at a number of jobs which included School Secretary at St. Pius X School and South Colonie Central School District. She retired from the NYS Department of Parole in 1993 after several years of dedicated service.

Rose will be lovingly remembered for her generosity, perseverance, determination and hard work ethic. She was fiercely proud of her Sicilian heritage, and was the Matriarch of the family.
