Latham - Andrew Roger Thomas Rosenbaum passed away on Sunday, December 3, 2023. Andrew was born on Friday, April 14, 1989, in West Chester, Ohio. Andrew served as the Head Golf Professional at Wolferts Roost Country Club since 2018 and previously served as the First Golf Assistant at Upper Montclair Country Club in Clifton, NJ. Andrew graduated from Clemson University in 2011 where he received his Class A PGA Certification. Andrew was very passionate about the game of golf, whether teaching or playing a round with members and friends.

Andrew never “met” a stranger and was a genuinely kind and generous person who tried to make everyone feel special. Family and friends were very important to Andrew as well as his faith.
