



Ann Kirby Flynn-Rockwell

April 29, 1924 - January 15, 2017

Albany-Ann Kirby Flynn-Rockwell, 92, of Albany, passed away on January 15th, 2017 in the Hospice Inn at St. Peter's Hospital. She was born into an Irish immigrant family in Astoria, Queens and held dual citizenship: United States and Ireland. Ann graduated from St. Patrick's Cathedral High School in Manhattan, where she was president of her senior class. A biology major, she graduated from Hunter College and later received a nursing degree from Hudson Valley Community College. A dedicated professional, Ann worked at Van Rensselaer Manor in Troy and at The Albany Veterans Administration Hospital. A lifelong pacifist and environmentalist, Ann was a pivotal activist in the successful fight against a coal plant on the Hudson River. She also worked to insure rights and proper care of the mentally ill.

Ann's marriage to Dr. Paul E. Rockwell ended in divorce after twenty-seven years. She is survived by nine of her ten children: Kathleen R. Lawrence, Susan Rockwell, Kevin Rockwell, Mary Ann Rockwell, Margaret Rockwell, Therese Rockwell, Taine Rockwell, Gerard Rockwell, and Brigid Rockwell. Her son Paul E. Rockwell Jr., a Vietnam Veteran, died in 1979. Herschel Berry, Brian Switzer, Judy Brownlow and Andrew Lawrence are also devoted long-time members of Ann's family. She leaves ten grandchildren: Margaret Kellogg, Peter Rockwell, James Rockwell, Nora R. Lawrence, Dawn Garrison, Gaia Sullivan, Samuel Flynn Levitt, Eoin Berry, Lydia Rockwell-Godman and Luke Switzer. Her two great-grandchildren are Blaise Lawrence Resing and

Calvin Wolf Garrison.
