



## Anthony J. Maddaloni

February 16, 1952 - January 11, 2014

Slingerlands-Anthony J. Maddaloni, 61, passed away on January 11th, 2014 after a courageous battle against cancer. He is survived by his wonderful wife of 32 years, Beverly, his two talented and creative sons Anthony J. Maddaloni III and John D. Maddaloni, his loving brother Dominick Maddaloni, and his brother in law Joe Zanta. He is predeceased by his parents Anthony J. and Antimina Maddaloni, his beautiful sister Rose Zanta, and his dear friend and colleague Larry Grasso. He was surrounded by his loyal friends who he is forever indebted to.

A native of Schenectady, born on February 16, 1952. Tony, became an uncle at eight years old. He grew up with, guided and loved his nieces and nephews, along with their spouses and children- Lisa Baker (Steve), Joey Zanta (Kathie), Michele Zanta, Christine Carr (Brian), Michael Maddaloni (Amy), Michele Duncan (Matt), and Dominick Maddaloni.

Tony received a BA from Siena College (1974) and a MPA from Maxwell School, Syracuse University (1975). He led a life of public service holding many government positions and developed many not-for-profit corporations. He was a leading healthcare consultant in New York State and assumed many roles during his life- AVP at Misericordia Hospital (Bronx), Director of the NYS DOH Bureau of Long Term Services, VP at St. Peter's Hospital, Chair of St. Peter's Addiction Recovery Center, Vice Chair/Treasurer of Our Lady of

Mercy Life Center and St. Peter's Nursing and Rehabilitation Center, a founding board member of McAuley Residence, a developer of the Family Health Center (Albany), CEO of The Community Hospice, and an adjunct professor at Sage Graduate School. He also served on the Board of Directors of the Voorheesville Community and School Foundation. In addition to being an official 10 time finisher of the Lake Placid Ironman Triathlon.
