Colonie - Arnold "Ron" Lagerroos, age 77, died peacefully in the early morning hours of Sunday, September 18, 2022.

Ron was born in Astoria, Queens, NY, in 1945 to Sulo and Hazel Lagerroos. He is survived by his son Davin, daughter-in-law Michelle, and grandchildren Mara and Avi, of Minneapolis, MN. He is also survived by his former wife, Linda LeClair, and former sisters-in-law Annette, Elizabeth and Maura LeClair. In addition to his parents, Ron was predeceased by his brother William of Madison, WI.

His interests included music, musical theater, movies, Civil War history, current affairs, and sports. More than anything, though, Ron hearted New York: he served its citizens for 35 years; he hiked in the Adirondacks; he gave subscriptions to The New Yorker as gifts; and he loved taking trips to New York City. Even when his health was starting to fail, he still managed a few trips to his favorite city to see museums, Christmas windows, and—especially—the theater. His love of Broadway was only matched by his love of his family and the joy he took in his grandchildren.
