



Daniel D. Davey

October 17, 1921 - February 19, 2015

Loudonville - Daniel D. Davey, 93, passed away Thursday February 19, 2015 after a short illness. He was born in Albany and has been an Albany resident for most of his life. He was the son of the late Anthony L. Davey and Angelina (Attanasio) Davey. Mr. Davey graduated from Christian Brothers Academy in 1939 and earned a Bachelor of Chemical Engineering Degree from Rensselaer Polytechnic Institute in 1943.

During World War II he served in the US Navy as an Aviation Electronic Technician Mate repairing and installing radio and radar equipment in naval aircraft. Upon being discharged from the Navy he owned and operated "Danny's" Restaurant in Schenectady, NY. After the sale of the restaurant he was employed by the New York State Department of Public Service as a Valuation Engineer for the next twenty years. He was then appointed an Administrative Law Judge for the NYS Department of Transportation, a position he held for 14 years. He retired in 1985.

Dan was a member of the Colonie Lodge of Elks BPOE # 2192 and was a communicant of St. Pius X Church in Loudonville. He was an avid Yankee baseball and Siena basketball fan, and enjoyed the camaraderie of his workouts at the JCC.

He is predeceased by his loving wife of 57 years, Joan L. (Sordet) Davey. He has two sons; Robert D. Davey (Patty Edwards) of Halfmoon, NY and James

R. Davey (wife Janice) of Frisco, TX and two grandsons, Scott Davey and Jeffrey Davey. He is the brother of Marion Marino, Anthony Davey, and the late John Davey.

Funeral services will be held Wednesday, February 25, 2015 at the McVeigh Funeral Home, 208 North Allen Street, Albany at 9:15 am, thence to St. Pius X Church, Loudonville at 10:00 am where a Mass of Christian Burial will be celebrated.

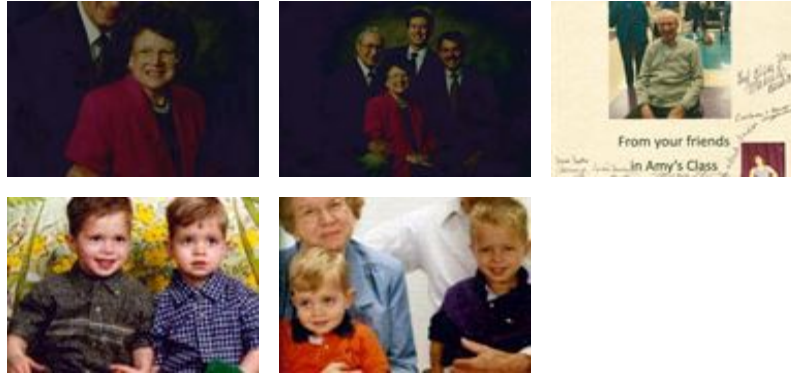
