I'd like to think we were good friends at one time - we lost touch quite awhile ago - Dan was so laid back about hiking and I was one of the crazies (recently finished the 46 in each month - they call us Gridiots) - the last time I saw Dan we had driven up North to hike Allen mountain - it was Spring time and the conditions were anticipated to be strenuous with heavy wet snow. Dan decided that he wasn't up to it so we went back home. Thinking back - I am pretty sure Allen was to be his last one. It is a long day - 18 miles. As I was working on "the Grid" I recall inviting him to join me for Allen in the months I hadn't yet done Allen. He declined for one reason or another and I gave up asking. I rec'd a random text from him - he asked if I was still mad at him - I said no but we never did connect for that last peak. It brings tears to my eyes. Those mountains aren't easy...hikers share a bond with the experiences they go through... I will be thinking of Dan as I hike tomorrow and say a prayer when I reach the summit.
