He served in the Army from 1955 to 1958. He graduated from San Francisco State University and received his Masters Degree in English Literature from Harvard University. He earned a PhD in English Literature from SUNY Binghamton.

After graduation, he was a Professor of English Literature at Hartwick College and Siena College where he began the Siena Poetry Series. He coached the

Siena Cross Country team, orienteering and cross country skiing. He was awarded the Fulbright Scholarship which brought him to teach abroad in Romania and Finland. He finished his career as Director of Management Information Services for New York State Social Services.

He co-founded and participated in the Albany Rowing Regatta. He was an avid runner and cyclist.

As someone who loved Kurt Vonnegut, and taught his writings at university, we can only imagine him saying today, "So it goes".
