Valatie-Frank J. Sidoti, 64, died Wednesday, June 15, 2011 at home. Born in Albany, he was the son of Irene Sidoti and the late Frank Sidoti.

Frank was a graduate of Cardinal McCloskey High School and had been in car sales since 1966. He enjoyed a more than 35 year career at Armory Garage, where he held many important positions.

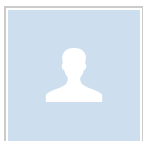
