



Frederic Maloy Stutzman

January 18, 1949 - April 1, 2024

Albany, NY-Frederic Maloy Stutzman, 75, passed away peacefully at home surrounded by family on Monday, April 1 2024. His wife and loving partner of 47 years, Anne Trulan Stutzman, was by his side.

Fred was born January 18, 1949, in Albany NY to the late Frederic H. Stutzman and Marjorie Maloy Stutzman. He graduated from Vincentian Institute, Villanova University (B.A.), and the University of North Carolina at Chapel Hill (MBA). Although he rooted for both Villanova and UNC, Fred was a lifelong Tar Heels fan, evidenced by the fact he cheered for UNC in the 2016 NCAA Championship (though he later declared, "I couldn't lose.")

In addition to Anne Trulan Stutzman, Fred is survived by his son, Frederic D. Stutzman (Chelcy) of Chapel Hill, NC; his daughter Ellen M. Stutzman (Atlas) of Los Angeles, CA.; his daughter Kathleen A. Stutzman (Greg) of Huntington, VT. He is survived by his sister, Mary Stutzman of Manhattan, NY (Timothy) and a brother, John Stutzman of Albany, NY (Janet). Fred is survived by his grandchildren, Frederic, John, and Robert Stutzman of Chapel Hill, NC, and Mateo Edwards of Los Angeles, CA. He is also survived by nieces, nephews, and cousins.

Fred spent his 45-year career building many of the Capital Region's major roads and highways as the Vice President and Treasurer of Hudson River

Construction Company and Albany Asphalt and Aggregates Corporation. He worked alongside his father, brother, and business partners Peter and Eugene Hallock, retiring in 2015 after successfully exiting the business. His children fondly recall Saturday mornings at the Port of Albany climbing giant mounds of gravel and doing other activities likely frowned upon by OSHA.

Throughout his life, Fred served on the board of numerous charitable, professional, and educational organizations, including Maria College, where he served as Chair of the Board of Trustees; The Academy of the Holy Names, where he served on the Board of Trustees as Treasurer; The Associated General Contractors of New York, where he served as Treasurer; The Associated General Contractors, where he served as Regional Director; The Empire State Concrete and Aggregate Producers Association, where he served as President and Treasurer, and the Friendly Sons of St. Patrick, where he served as President.

In addition to being a Tar Heels fan, Fred was an avid golfer and lover of thoroughbred racing, spending summers at his box in Saratoga. Fred was also a Yankees and long-suffering Giants fan. A member of the International Churchill Society, Fred studied the works and biographies of Churchill and avidly read histories of World War II. In retirement, he and Anne traveled extensively, visiting children and grandchildren, national parks, and touring through Latin America and Europe. A communicant of Mater Christi Parish, Fred spent his time volunteering with Catholic Charities of the Diocese of Albany, working at the food pantry and welcome table.
