Wyld, Gail L – at peace at last, Gail L. Wyld passed away July 16, 2010 while on holiday in Rimini, Italy.

Gail was born December 29, 1932 and was the daughter of John S. Wyld, Sr. and Grace L. Wyld of Albany. She was the twin sister of Joyce A. Wyld Lasseter. Both her parents and sister predeceased Gail. She is survived by her brother John S. Wyld Jr. and his wife Elizabeth Allen Wyld, their children, Elizabeth Connors Wyld and her daughter, Victoria Rose Smith-Wyld of Albany, John S. Wyld, III and his wife Victoria Palmer Wyld of Niskayuna. She is also survived by her nephew Stewart Williamson Lasseter and his wife Alexandra of Arizona, and her niece Diana Lasseter Drake, her husband Gary, and their children Julia Grace and Hunter Raymond of Pennington N.J.

Gail was a graduate of Vincentian Institute and the College of St. Rose. She had a long career in secondary education as well as holding a number of positions in institutions of higher education. She began her career in the Albany Public School system, teaching in the Wm. S. Hackett Middle School. She returned to the College of St. Rose to become the Director of Public Relations at the college, while also pursuing post-graduate advancement in the field of school counseling. She acted in various administrative and academic positions next at the College of Mt. St. Vincent in metropolitan New York and then took on similar positions at Cazenovia College in Cazenovia

NY. She returned to the Capital District and resumed her work in middle and secondary education as a guidance counselor for many years in the Ballston Spa School district. Following her retirement she resided in the Manchester area of Vermont.

Gail was a kind and gentle soul always wanting to do the right thing for others, often times at the expense of her own well-being. She was thoughtful and thought provoking, well-read and often times would interject new grammatical terms such as holistic or unflappable, which at the time befuddled our father as to their meaning.
