



Gariba Al-Abdul Korah

June 5, 1960 - February 16, 2021

Albany - Gariba Al-Abdul Korah was born on June 5th 1960 to Moses Bornaa Abudu Korah and Mary-Magdalene Zinenta in Kaleo in the Upper West Region of Ghana, and passed away February 16, 2021 at home, surrounded by his beloved family. He was the 5th child of his mother and one of many by his father. Gariba was among the privileged few who attended school and would later dedicate his life to being a teacher.

He graduated from the University of Minnesota, Twin Cities in 2004 with a Ph.D. in African History. In August of 2004, Gariba joined the department of History and Political science at the College of Saint Rose where he attained the rank of full professor. He also held a part time teaching position at SUNY – Albany.

Gariba Al-Abdul Korah was a loving husband, father, grandfather, brother and friend who loved telling stories, watching soccer and making those around him laugh. He was a passionate teacher and researcher who relentlessly dedicated himself to his craft. His absence leaves an indelible void in the lives of those who love him. And even as we grieve his passing, we take solace in the adage that the gods take away the young mortals they love, and fate owes us no justification for how it unfolds. It is our prayer that the gates of paradise

will be open for him as a sign of his final victory.

Gariba is survived by his wife Gladys, daughter Bernice, daughter Diku, daughter Danielle, son Morgan, son Daniel, sister Agnes, sister Jane, nephew Moses, nephew Martin, niece Jane, niece Maud, niece Marcia and grandchildren Samairah and Micah. He also leaves behind many loving cousins, in-laws and friends in Canada, Norway, United States, United Kingdom and Ghana.
