Loudonville-John G. Fremont (Jay), of Loudonville, died peacefully on December 18th, 2014, at St. Peter's Hospice Inn, after a long illness. Born in Troy, NY on June 14th, 1944 and raised on Garner St. in Cohoes, he was the son of the late John Fremont and Mary Kelly Reed (formerly Fremont).

Jay graduated from LaSalle Institute (Class of 1962) in Troy and attended The State University of New York at Oneonta. He retired 10 years ago as Director of Member Services for the New York State Employees Retirement System after 40 years of service.
