Colonie -John E. Tutein left this life on July 12, 2019 after a long battle with heart and kidney problems. He was a graduate of Blessed Sacrament School, Christian Brothers Academy and Rensselaer Polytechnic Institute, graduating in 1970 as a Chemical Engineer. He was honorably discharged from the U.S. Army Corps of Engineers.

John retired after many years as a Senior Engineering Specialist with Factory Mutual.

He was a member of the American Institute of Chemical Engineers, National Fire Protection Association, Society of Fire Protection Engineers, International Association of Arson Investigators, and New York State Fire Investigators.

He served as Past President and Captain of the former West Albany Volunteer Fire Company No. 1, Volunteer Paramedic with the Town of Colonie EMS Department, Scoutmaster, Explorer Advisor, and Camping Committee Member with the Twin Rivers Council Boy Scouts of America. He had also served as a volunteer First Aid and CPR instructor with the American Red Cross and a certified pistol and rifle instructor with the National Rifle Association.

various roles including Nature Director, Rifle Range Director, Health Officer and Assistant Ranger.
