



## Kevin D. Sheridan

Clifton Park-Kevin D. Sheridan, 53, died Thursday, November 7, 2013. Born in Manhattan, he was the son of Shirley McOsker Sheridan and the late John J. Sheridan. He was the devoted and loving husband for 26 years of Dodee Blaaboer Sheridan; beloved father of Caitlin, Courtney and Carly; loving grandfather of Elizabeth; brother of Kathleen Rissberger (Thomas); he is survived by several nieces, nephews, cousins, aunts, uncles, friends and brotherhood of men and women of Corrections.
