



Lisa Lyon Evans

September 7, 1945 - June 20, 2017

Selkirk, NY – Lisa Lyon Evans, 71, of Cedar Hill died on Tuesday, June 20, 2017 at her great grandfather’s “bungalow” on her beloved Hudson River with friends and family at her side.

Lisa was born in New York City. She was the daughter of the late Robert Leigh Lyon and Jean Murray Lyon. Lisa was educated at St. Agnes School, St Patrick’s School in Ravena, Academy of the Holy Names, Vermont Junior College, and SUNY Albany.
