She was especially interested in gun control issues and lobbied in support of the Brady Bill.

She was chairwoman of the Fresh Air fund in Greenwich, Conn.

Lucile's generosity extended well beyond her family; she was on the Board of Visitors of O.D. Heck Developmental Center, a longtime volunteer at Parsons Child and Family Center, and a frequent reader for WMHT's RISE program. She was an enthusiastic hostess who delighted in gift-giving and in organizing challenging games for family party-goers.

Lucile was a graduate of Miss Porter's School in Farmington, CT and attended the University of Bridgeport and Finch College in Manhattan.
