Bell Canyon, CA-Mario Joseph De Carlo, 78, passed away September 11, 2013 at the Motion Picture & Television Hospital in Calabasas, CA. Born in Albany, N.Y. to Sicilian immigrants Giuseppe Di Carlo and Mary Strano, he was an altar boy, president of his class at Cathedral Academy school and a U.S. Marine stationed in Japan. After marriage to Joan Steigerwald of Coxsackie in 1961, they moved to Los Angeles, where he received a degree from the University of Southern California, and in the mid-1960s started employment with NBC studios, a company he remained with for over 40 years. An award winning sound engineer, "Joey Vegas" worked in the studio, then sports, then the news department. During his career, he traveled the world, covered the presidential campaigns of Walter Mondale and George H. W. Bush and loved what he did.

Predeceased by former spouse Joan and brother Salvatore Di Carlo, he leaves behind a son, Anthony, sister Mary (Tony) Coluccio, nephews Paul and Joseph and scores of folks he made laugh, he helped out and that will miss him. Along with his affinity for Stan Musial and the Cardinals, he'll be remembered for his sense of humor, generosity and for frequently asking if you're ready to go, before you'd even had your toast.
