



## M. Jane Tyrrell

August 6, 1922 - January 6, 2011

Albany-M. Jane Stiglmeier Tyrrell, beloved mother, sister, grandmother and aunt passed away peacefully Thursday evening, January 6, 2011 at the Hospice Inn at St. Peter's Hospital surrounded by her loving family.

Born August 6, 1922 in Albany, she was the daughter of the late Albert F. and Clarice McAllister Stiglmeier. Jane was the wife of the late Dr. Thomas I. Tyrrell; beloved mother of Thomas R. Tyrrell (Leah), Susan T. Moore (Donald) and Timothy M. Tyrrell (Karen); grandmother of Thomas Tyrrell, II, Emily Tyrrell, Hannah Moore, Timothy Tyrrell, Jr. and Brendan Tyrrell; sister of Eileen Cameron, Dr. John Stiglmeier (Donna) and the late Albert Stiglmeier; dear friend of Mary Drislane; also survived by many nieces and nephews.

Jane was a graduate of Vincentian Institute and St. Peter's Hospital School of Nursing. She served in the US Army as a 2nd Lt. Nurse at Borden General Hospital, Chickasha, OK from 1945 to 1946. There she received the American Campaign Medal and the World War II Victory Medal. Jane worked for many years as a Registered Nurse at St. Peter's Hospital and upon retirement became the school nurse at The Albany Academy for Girls.

She was a member of Albany Country Club, Ladies of Charity, and an Associate of the Sisters of Mercy. She was a longtime volunteer at St. Peter's Hospital and Becky's House, and a member and leader of St. Peter's

Auxiliary.

Jane was the embodiment of kindness and grace. She lived each day to the fullest and was most happy when she was in the company of her children and grandchildren. She was known for her generosity of spirit and her sense of humor. Her many friends spanned all generations. She never had an unkind word and treasured each of her many friendships.

The family would like to express a heartfelt thank you to the many doctors, nurses, and staff at St. Peter's Hospital for providing compassionate and wonderful care to Jane, especially the staff and good friends on 6 McAuley, the 3rd floor Rehab Department and the Dialysis Department. In her final days Jane was cared for by the dedicated and caring staff and volunteers at the St. Peter's Hospice Inn. The family is grateful to all who made Jane's passing a peaceful and dignified experience.

Funeral services Monday, January 10, 2011 at 11:00 am at the Parish of Mater Christi (formerly St. Catherine of Siena Church) where a Mass of Christian Burial will be celebrated.
