



Dr. Roger James Ciotti

Albany- Dr. Roger James Ciotti, 77, of Albany, passed away peacefully following a brief illness on March 31, 2018, surrounded by his daughters, sons-in-law, and grandchildren. Roger was born in Freeport, NY, to Chester Ciotti and Grace (Braren) Ciotti (deceased). After graduating from Freeport High School, Roger earned his bachelor's degree from Boston University, followed by his Doctor of Dental Medicine degree from Tufts School of Dental Medicine in Boston, Massachusetts. In addition to practicing as a general dentist for over 40 years, Roger served as a Captain in the U.S. Army Reserves as part of the 3298th Dental Detachment.

An avid fitness enthusiast, Roger was a regular fixture at the Albany YMCA, where he enjoyed visiting with friends as well as working out on an almost daily basis. While he would never use the term himself, Roger was a "foodie" at heart, enjoying dining out with family and friends; the more unusual and obscure the restaurant, the better. One of Roger's favorite places to visit was Mohonk Mountain House, in New Paltz, NY, where he spent many summers with his family enjoying the peaceful scenery and of course, the great food.

Roger leaves behind his loving daughters Nicole (Ciotti) Gardenier of Franklin, Massachusetts, and Renee Ciotti of Warren, Vermont, his sons-in-law Michael Gardenier and Jonathan Young and his beloved grandchildren Alexander, Madeline, and Greta. Known as "Buddy" to his grandchildren, Roger was

always eager to spend time with the kids who were truly the “apples of his eye.” They were very fortunate to have experienced his love and devotion. Roger also leaves behind many neighbors and friends, who affectionately knew him as "Doc."

Roger is survived by his brother, Daniel Ciotti and his wife Meredith, of Walpole, Massachusetts, and his cousin Cindy (Nass) Roberts and her husband, Dr. Rick Roberts. In addition to his sister-in-law Agnes (Black) Ciotti, Roger leaves behind his nieces Jennifer, Teresa, Sara, Cynthia, Kimberly, Danielle, and his nephew, Glenn. He is pre-deceased by his brother Chester Ciotti, Jr. of Suffield, Connecticut as well as his aunts and uncles Jean, Bernard, Ethel, her husband Leon, and John.

Roger's sense of humor, generosity towards others, and caring spirit will be profoundly missed by all those who knew and loved him, living on in the open hearts of his children and grandchildren.
