



Terrence "Mr. Lucky" Vennard

March 9, 1948 - April 27, 2010

Albany-Terrence " Mr. Lucky" J. Vennard, 62, died Tuesday, April 27, 2010 at home. Born in Albany, he was the son of the late Joseph and Tekla Polak Vennard. He graduated from St. Casimir's School, Christian Brothers Academy, and Sage College.

Terry began his career like his father, as a proud member of the Operating Engineers, Local 106 before joining the NYS Department of Transportation as a Safety Training Specialist, where he enjoyed a long career in developing important work zone and safety policies, along with innovations in snow removal. Working with SEMA, he was also a First Responder to the World Trade Center tragedy.

He was a member of the Polish Community Center, Knights of Columbus, Polish American Community Center, and Sons of the American Legion. Terry was a communicant of the former St. Casimir Church and Holy Cross Church. He was an avid fan of the New York Giants and Mets, loved golfing and handicapping horses.

He was the beloved father of Stacey Kirk (Matt) and Tim Vennard (Jessica); cherished grandfather of Evan, Andrew, Tyler and Macen; dear brother of Diane Vennard; former husband of Michele Vennard; dear friend of Gail Crisafulli; many cousins and other family members survive.

Funeral services Saturday, May 1, 2010 at 8:15 am from the McVeigh Funeral Home, 208 North Allen Street, Albany thence to Blessed Sacrament Church, Albany at 9:00 am where a Mass of Christian Burial will be celebrated.
