



## Thomas Joseph Murnane MD

January 15, 1936 - August 22, 2024

Delmar, NY-Thomas Joseph Murnane, MD entered Eternal Life Thursday, August 22, 2024 at Albany Medical Center Hospital.

Son of Ignatius Joseph Murnane, MD and Loretta C. Thompson, he was born in Albany, NY on January 15th, 1936 and graduated from Vincentian Institute of Albany, class of 1953, received a BS from Georgetown University in 1957 and then completed his Doctorate of Medicine from the Georgetown School of Medicine in 1961. Upon graduation he completed an internship at Bronx Municipal Hospital/Albert Einstein School of Medicine in 1961-62.

He served as a Lieutenant in the United States Navy Medical Corp from 1962-65 based in Hawaii. Afterwards he completed his Radiology residency at Albany Medical Center 1965-68 and a Fellowship of Nuclear Medicine 1968-69. He served as a faculty member of the Albany Medical Center 1968-76. The bulk of his career was in private radiology practice in Delmar NY (1976-2016). During this time, he was on staff at St. Peter's, Child's and the Albany VA Hospitals.

During his education he worked a wide variety of jobs including driving trucks as a Teamster, installing lines for Niagara-Mohawk and maintaining tracks as a "gandy dancer" for D&H Railroad.

He was predeceased by his wife Elinor Joyce Hughes Murnane, two infant daughters Mary and Theresa and his brother Joseph Michael. He is survived by his children Thomas F. Murnane, Matthew J. Murnane, MD, James A. Murnane (Barbara), Amy K. Donofrio (Kent), two brothers Peter T. Murnane (Carol) and James I. Murnane (Barbara), grandchildren Margaret, Isabella, Evan, Aidan, Elena and several nieces and nephews.
