Albany-William Philip Klose (affectionately known as “Big Guy”), loving husband and father of three, died on Thursday, September 2nd, 2021 at the age of 53.

Will was born to William J. Klose and Regina C. Klose on April 9th, 1968 in Albany, New York. He was a loving brother to Valerie Sacks and Dennis Klose. He attended Colonie High School and graduated from Villanova University. He worked at Progressive Auto Insurance for 30 years. He is survived by his wife, Karen LaVigne Klose, whom he married in 1993, and three children: Caroline Grace, Susanna Margaret, and William Paul Klose, his mother and father Will and Regina, his sister Valerie Sacks (Gary Sacks), his brother Dennis Klose (Virginia Cataldo), his mother in law Sue LaVigne, his brothers in law PJ LaVigne (Lisa LaVigne) and Kevin LaVigne (Shannon LaVigne), and his many nieces, nephews, and friends. 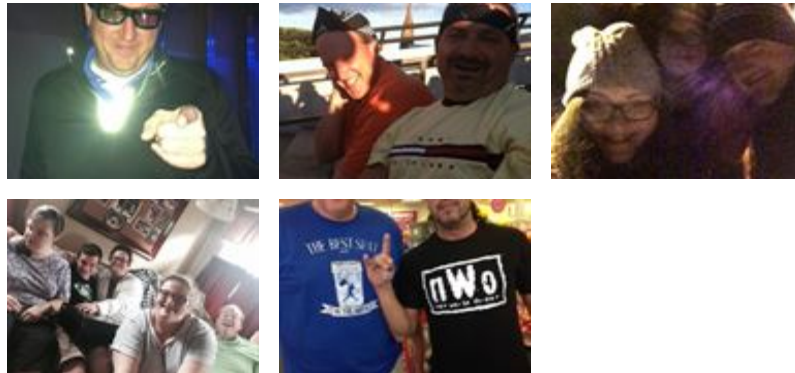

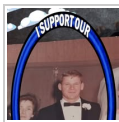

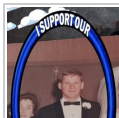
